Dear Church Members and associates,

I am writing to update you on the church's response to the outbreak of Coronavirus.

Suspension of Public worship

On the 17th March I received a letter from our Archbishops Sentamu and Justin stating that, 'public worship will have to stop for our season'. Public worship is central to the life of the church and so it is with a heavy heart that I am seceding to this. I recognise that these are unique circumstances and that this is the right course of action as do the wardens of the church. Therefore, as of now all events in the church diary are either postponed or cancelled including our worship services on a Sunday.

We have though been encouraged to keep our churches open for private prayer. On Sunday the 22nd March the church will be open from 9am until noon for any of you who want to pray and worship God. Please use the hand sanitiser provided on entering and leaving the building, keeping a sensible distance apart from any other parishioners praying. The church will also be open on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 10am until noon for any who want to offer up their prayers.

Our Archbishops are encouraging a day of prayer and action this coming Sunday – Mothering Sunday 22^{nd} March. Please join them in prayer and action on this day remembering particularly the sick and anxious. They write, 'As one action, we are calling on everyone to place a lighted candle in their window at 7pm as a sign of solidarity and hope in the light of Christ that can never be extinguished'.

A prayer for those affected by Coronavirus

Keep us, good Lord, under the shadow of your mercy.
Sustain and support the anxious, be with those who care for the sick, and lift up all who are brought low; that we may find comfort knowing that nothing can separate us from your love in Christ Jesus our Lord.
