

A Message from the Vicar

Recently we prayed for 19 Buddhist monks conducting a 2,300 mile "walk of peace" across the United States. The intention of their walk is to promote peace, unity, and compassion; intentions which I do admire.

Some have asked me for my view on Buddhism, which I will share with you now. Since I am sharing my view, I may as well share my view on all faiths including Judaism.

My view is formed by scripture, as you would hope. If you get time, please read John 8:31 – 47. Jesus is speaking to some Jews who don't recognise Him as the Son of God. He says to them, 'If God really were your Father, you would love me, because I came from God and now I am here.' He then says to them, 'You are children of your father, the Devil'.

My understanding from scripture is that every person has God, or the Devil as their Father. If a person loves, and so obeys Him (Jesus) and recognises his identity, then their Father is God. If they do not then their father is the Devil.

I would encourage you to pray for these monks that on their journey they might come to know Jesus, and so God as their Father.

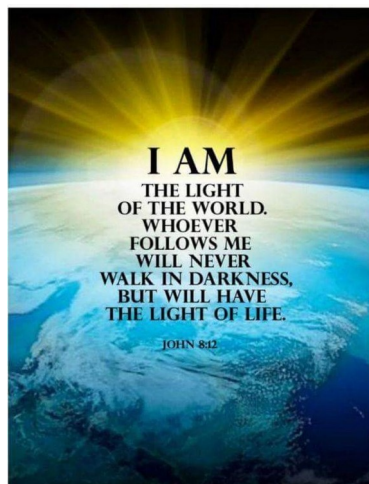
